Let's take time to reflect today. Recall how one Sunday last month, I read the letter from Rev. Melanie Morel-Ensminger from New Orleans when they sent us a generous donation of \$275. This kindness from a church that still does not have 100% electricity! Well, I called her to thank her and to get suggestions on our own recovery. She had some excellent insights.

- ◆ Immediately after the storm, men cope more poorly, more temper outbursts, use of alcohol, etc., and women were generally too busy to feel anything-dealing with insurance, etc.
- ◆ Two to three years later, men were fine; now women started to show more symptoms of depression, agoraphobia
- ◆ Church services, newsletter, for a long time must focus on healing and recovery not the usual intellectual exploration-healing as a community, being gentle with Yourself, reaching out, accepting help as a sign of health, new beginnings, new hope, recalling how the community and the church and individuals have survived other disasters, celebrate any sign of recovery-she cautioned going back to business as usual too quickly and just covering our wounds.

This information makes us pause and recognize how sig-

nificant an event this hurricane has been in reshaping our lives in so many ways-homes, jobs, friends, mechanics, doctors, hair dressers and so on. But what other disasters have we survived? All have had personal traumas that we have overcome and as a community we have the wonderful legacy of rebuilding after the 1900 storm. The connections and caring of our fellowship will sustain us all as we pull together-allowing ourselves to cry over losses including favorite shops well as our personal losses. And to celebrate and mark each sign of recovery.

I can relate to just taking care of business. Melanie talked about of the aftermath. The fellowship has been a great source of connection to the greater community--a sense of not being alone in all this chaos. I wish for it to be a place of hope for all of us. Observe yourself and your fellow members. How are we doing? Are we balancing between what needs to be done and caring for self? Are we patient with those around us who are suffering as well?

Personally, I have begun walking my neighborhood again and was recently touched by a beautiful, perfect pink rose on a scraggly bush with no leaves. Awed by its survival, I was briefly tempted to take it home but then imagined how many other souls it would cheer just where it was. And I have returned to painting. I photographed beautiful sunrises in my temporary home for inspiration. New story ideas are forming in my head. These outlets will release my fears and anxieties as well as create new hope. But I still take lots of naps, gripe with my friends and eat too much chocolate and wine.

Let us all pause to take stock and continue to be gentle with ourselves and each other.

Action to End Death Penalty:

After two decades the United States still has not signed and ratified the Convention on the Rights of the Child which internationally recognizes a child's political, cultural, social, and economic rights. As of the beginning of this month, 193 countries have ratified the Convention, including every member of the United Nations except the United States and Somalia.

The main reason the US has not ratified the Convention is because **the State of Texas allows children to be given the death penalty**, which the Convention would not allow. By refusing to sign the Convention, the US continues to condone the legal execution of children. President Barack Obama has described the U.S.' failure to ratify the Convention as 'embarrassing' and has promised to review this.

Now is the time to hold the President to his promise and urge him to stand up for Human Rights and protect children world-wide. Please take action by writing to President Obama to urge him to quickly sign this important international convention to protect the children of the world from harm. The absence of the United States from this convention weakens its force, not only in the United States, but around the world. The Canadian Government has signed the convention.

Through targeted education, advocacy and outreach, we engage Unitarian Universalists in support of international cooperation and the work of the United Nations.
