Earle Canfield and Mary Jane have been returning every year to Nepal for the past 17 years. Ten years ago, they established ANSWER to educate disadvantaged children when they placed a little street girl in a private school for higher caste children and watched her shoot to the top. Little Uma graduated with Distinction in Nursing and is now part of an organization of 700 students and career professionals being educated and working in Nepal to improve their country. These children are the vanguard for undercutting the caste system there. Earle Canfield is the Executive Director of ANSWER, a 501c3 program that places indigent, low caste children in high caste schools in Nepal in order to undercut the caste system there. ANSWER is a unique, model organization and you can learn more about his organization on their website www.answernepal.org. Earle is a member of the UU Church of the Larger Fellowship and a



supporting friend of the International Council of the UU. He visits UU congregations all over the US and has 400 UU members supporting the children they serve and their schools.

Our Southwestern UU Conference (SWUUC) offers us the opportunity to help other congregations grow and develop.

The "Chalice Lighters" project has been around since 1984. Individual UUs sign up to contribute \$10 or more up to three times a year, to help a congregation in their district complete

a special project linked to growth. Our SWUU district includes most of Texas; all of Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana; and parts of Tennessee, Missouri, and Mexico.

Over the years UUs have donated millions of dollars to help other UU congregations in their

development. Projects often focus on helping congregations call a minister or construct a

Here's how it works: In a Chalice Lighter call, members in congregations across a district agree to contribute a set amount several times a year to help a congregation achieve a specific goal. In 2010 the SWUUC project was Huntsville UU church, and this year it is the Westside UU Church in Fort Worth.

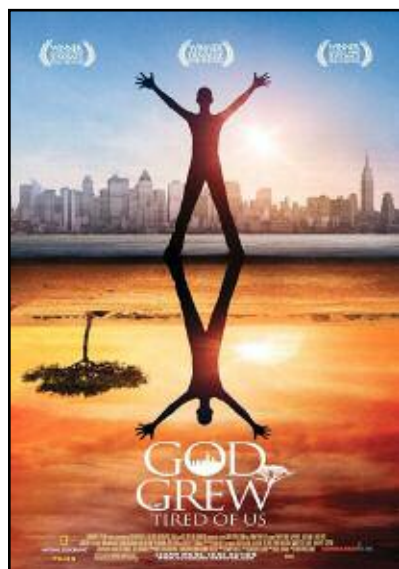

UUFG's Kiva Portfolio Continues To Grow

In recent weeks we have added loans to the UUFGC Kiva "portfolio" as previous loans have been repaid. Since joining Kiva in March 2007 we have made 171 loans totaling over \$5000, and have donated \$342.50 to support Kiva's activities. We make loans as we receive donations and re-lend as existing loans are repaid, and currently have \$739.95 out in loans. We are part of the UU "lending team" which has 583 members who have made 10,222 loans totaling \$353,900. (We have 131 loans through that team, with the average team member having 17.5!) It is easy and very satisfying to help people around the world, by donating what is a small amount to us, but makes a huge difference to them in developing countries. We are even able to donate locally on occasion! All our lending funds have been donated for this purpose by our members and friends, and new donations are always welcome. Margaret Canavan manages our Kiva activity and she welcomes feedback from you.
